

Three Little Pitties Transport: Adoption Coordinator Option

For help placing dogs & puppies with out of state adopters



Thank you for being this animal's advocate. It's easy to look the other way, but you didn't. Take a moment to celebrate the part you have played in saving a life.

If the following applies to you, you may be a good fit for the DOG adoption coordinator option:

- You would prefer to **foster** (dogs in boarding are accepted for this option on a rare case by case basis; dogs coming straight from a shelter are inelligible) the dog until it gets adopted (average time is 3-6 weeks) rather than spend the \$200 for a networked spot

AND

- Based on your experience with this dog you think they might require a special adopter and/or would like to meet (via FaceTime) the adopters prior to the dog's travel to ensure a good fit

AND

- You are able to take the dog to Alvin, TX for a 1 hour video shoot and "meet and greet" with our adoption coordinator

AND

- You are willing to drive any unaltered dog over 5 months to a low-cost clinic in order to get spayed or neutered. Three Little Pitties will only pay for this appointment if you agree to go to the low-cost clinic (in your area) that we give prior approval for

AND

- Are willing to accept personal liability for any medical needs or care that the dog needs between now and transport day, beyond basic intake and spay/neuter if not already completed

Requirements

1. All dogs must have (can be provided by 3LP)
 - a. 2 DHPP vaccines given a MINIMUM of 14 days apart
 - b. 1 Bordetella vaccine
 - c. 1 Rabies vaccine (12 weeks & older)
 - d. Deworming protocol as dictated by the 3LP adoption coordinator
2. All dogs must have a negative heartworm test result from the last 30 days (required at booking)
3. All dogs traveling must have been in foster for at least 14 days prior to departure. You MUST provide your own foster arrangements.
4. Dogs that are dog or human aggressive will be unable to travel. If a dog shows up to transport with aggressive behavior towards dogs or humans, they will be removed from transport.

How to Book Your Spot

1. Step 1: Fill out this [form](https://forms.gle/Bb8ZDibnwChKn9nV6) (https://forms.gle/Bb8ZDibnwChKn9nV6)
2. Step 2: Within 72 hours send ONE EMAIL PER DOG (or one email for a litter of puppies under 12 weeks) containing ALL of the following to whitneydeanne@gmail.com. This must be a NEW email, not a reply, and must have a subject line of “[Dog’s Name] Adoption Coordinator Request”
 - a. A clear, in the light, close up photo of all dogs
 - b. Scanned or photographed copies of any records for all dogs
 - c. For every dog over 6 months you will also need:
 - i. Proof of a HW negative test (vet records, shelter records, or IDEXX snap test photo) from the last 30 days
 - ii. a link to YouTube video or a public Facebook post with a video. Videos sent as attachments will not be accepted. Unacceptably blurry, dark, or brief clips will be not be accepted. The purpose is the see the dog’s temperament and body language, and if that is not accomplished then the request will need to be resubmitted.
 1. getting a treat
 2. walking on a leash
 3. off leash around other similarly sized dogs
 4. with a human in their face
3. Please wait 72 hours after the completion of both steps for a reply.

Once the dog has been adopted, please make arrangements to bring your animal and all of their printed medical records to Sienna at 6 Vet Clinic (8790 Hwy 6, #100, Missouri City, TX 77459) at 6:45pm on the night of your travel date. Plan to stay for 60-90 minutes to complete the health certificate and properly load the van.

If you prefer the adoption coordinator option please note:

1. The adoption fee will cover the cost associated with travel, and you will not owe \$200.
2. If a dog arrives to an adopter and due to undisclosed behavior or medical issues must return to Texas, you will at that time be charged \$400 (\$100 for cats) for the round-trip expense and will be blocked from sending animals until this payment is collected. If you fail to reclaim the animal we reserve the right to take it to a shelter if needed.
3. If a dog arrives to an adopter and due to disclosed behavior issues is surrendered by the adopter, the adoption coordinator will partner with the adopter and our no-kill shelter partners to find the best option for rehoming the dog.
4. **If your coordinator says that for any reason they do not feel comfortable adopting out this dog, we will be unable to help further.**
5. If you prefer this option, please select "I want to work with an adoption coordinator" form the GoogleForm and also include a sentence stating this in the body of the email for outlined under "How to Book Your Spot" step 2.
